IMPORTANT INFORMATION TO PARENTS AND STUDENTS

FEES

Candidates selected at the interview for the first year of the course shall remit the fees immediately. Fees once paid will not be refunded on any account. The students shall pay the fees for each term before the date fixed for such payment. The students are strictly asked to pay the fees within the stipulated date given in the calendar. On any account, late payment will not be accepted. In case the student leaving the college after admission any time before completing the course, have to pay the entire fees for the year and should not claim any refund.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

The working day is divided into five periods of sixty minutes duration of each hour. Attendance will be taken every hour. No student shall be absent from the college without permission. One hour of unauthorized absence in a class will be considered half-a-day leave and two hours of such absence will be deemed as one-day leave. The leave letter must be submitted in advance or on the next successive date without fail. Actions will be taken if absent without leave letter. Leave letters should be submitted to the Class teacher and countersigned by the Parent/Guardian and the Principal.

A student who puts in 75% of attendance will be eligible to appear for University Examination (Theory & Practical). If a candidate fails to put in the minimum attendance percentage stipulated (75%) condonation of shortage of attendance is permitted up to 10% (i.e.65%) after collecting a fee of Rs. 250/- (each) for Theory / Practical. Candidates who have put in less than 65% of attendance but more than 50% of attendance are not eligible for condonation of shortage of attendance, such candidates will not be permitted to appear for the regular examinations, but will be

allowed to proceed to the next year / semester of the course. They may be permitted to take up the next University Examination by paying the condonation fee only if they attain the requisite percentage of attendance. Candidates who have attained less than 50% of attendance have to repeat the course by rejoining after obtaining prior permission from the University to rejoin the course. A minimum of 90% attendance is required for scholarship purposes.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

- ♣ Student shall conduct themselves properly both within and outside the premises. The good name of the college depends upon the conduct of the students. If any student is found short of good behaviour and discipline, she shall be severely penalized or even expelled from the college by the authorities.
- This college runs by Jains which is strongly committed to strict vegetarianism. Hence, students are forbidden from bringing and consuming non-vegetarian food of any kind including eggs inside the college and hostel premises. Violation of this rule will lead to severe penalty or even dismissal from college.
- The students are strictly prohibited from bringing mobile phones or any other electronic devices. If found, strict action will be taken.
- Students should wear neat, decent and respectable dress such as Salwarkameez, Chudidhar, HalfSarees and Sarees. They should conform to the standards of modesty maintained by the institution.
- ❖ Students should greet the members of the staff and step aside to let them pass. They should stand up when any staff member enters the classroom.

- ♣ Students shall not enter the staff room or office without permission.
- ♣ Students should assemble for common prayer as soon as the bell rings and stand in a line. Late comers will be fined a sum of Rs.25/per day.
- ♣ Students should be punctual to the classes. A student must not enter or leave the class without the permission of the lecturer.
- Strict silence should be observed during class hours both in and outside the classes. When classes are dismissed students should move from one class to other in an orderly manner without causing disturbance to other classes.
- ♣ Students should attend all the remedial coaching classes in the subjects in which they are found weak.
- Students should purchase the prescribed textbook and are expected to bring them to the classes without fail.
- ❖ Students should see the notice board for any information.
- Students should not organize meetings of any nature inside or outside the college campus or Collect funds or distribute circulars and notices in the college without prior permission from Principal.
- Senior students should not rag or harass junior students. Students who resort to such ragging will be severely punished and even expelled from the college.
- The students of this college shall respect all religions. The authorities will not countenance anyone who talks ill of any religion or faith. Parents are requested to strictly advice their wards in this regard.
- ♣ Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and help keeping the college premises neat and clean.

- ♣ Parents / Guardians are not permitted to meet their wards or Head of the Departments or Lecturers directly to discuss any matter pertaining to their wards. All such matters should be brought to the notice of the Principal in writing after seeking a prior appointment.
- Discipline should be maintained during prayer and National Anthem.
- ♣ Hold the values of swatch bharat.
- All students who come to college by two wheelers are asked to wear a helmet.
- ♣ If there is any change in the contact number the students are asked to inform in the office immediately.
- * Breach on any of the above rules will lead to disciplinary action resulting even in expulsion.
- The authorities seek the kind Co-operation of the Parents / Guardians in this regard to help the college to do its best for the students

EXAMINATIONS AND PERIODIC TESTS

- Mid-Semester and Model examinations are conducted every semester. The student performance in the examination will be discussed during Parent's Teacher's Meet.
- Parents are asked to attend the Parent's Teacher's Meet compulsory.
- ♣ Based on the performance of the students in these examinations, the Principal decides on the eligibility of the student to appear for the University Examinations. The decision of the Principal is final.
- A student who fares very badly in these examinations or has insufficient attendance will not be permitted to write the University Examinations.

Continuous internal assessment marks will be allotted based on the performance of the students in the Mid-Semester and Model examinations.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

A Student will be eligible to appear for the University examinations, if,

- ❖ She has attained the requisite 75% attendance.
- Her conduct and progress in studies during the year have been satisfactory.
- She has paid all the fees and arrears and has obtained a "No Dues" clearance from the respective Head of Departments

LIBRARY

- The College library is open to all members of the college on every working day. Each and Every student, on being enrolled in the college becomes a member of the college library.
- ♣ Strict silence should be observed in the library.
- No member shall take any printed book or notebook into the library without the permission of the Librarian.
- # Each member is allowed to borrow three books at a time.
- ♣ Books must not be marked or defaced. The pages should not be earmarked. Students should examine each book before borrowing it and report to the librarian, if any damage found therein.
- Periodicals placed on the magazine racks should not be mishandled and should be replaced in the proper place after use.
- * Reference books and periodicals will not be loaned, but will be available for reference within the library.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- ♣ Overdue charges at Rs. 5/- per day shall be imposed for each day if the borrowed book is overdue.
- ♣ Absence from the college shall not be admitted as an excuse for delay in returning the borrowed book.
- ♣ The Librarian may recall any book at any time even before the expiry of the normal period of the loan.
- ♣ If a member has lost or damaged one book of a set, the whole set has to be replaced by the member
- ♣ No member of the staff or student is allowed to lend the library books to any one inside or outside the college.
- ♣ Any book, which is in great demand, shall be lent only for three days.
- ♣ Library books and library cards must be returned to the Library at the end of the academic year, on the date specified by the Librarian.

LABORATORY

- ♣ The timing for the laboratory are 9.00 am to 3.40 pm.
- ♣ The Science labs are well equipped with latest instruments. Great care must be taken in handling the apparatus.
- Computer Science and Application labs are provided with expensive systems, servers, printers and UPS. Care and caution are therefore needed in this case from the students, staff members and the attendants.
- All breakages, damages and losses will be recovered from the students concerned individually or collectively. These should be brought to the notice of the Principal forthwith.
- ♣ The worktables and sanitary fittings should be taken care by the students, the Heads of the Departments and Lecturers in charge.

GRIEVANCE CELL

The Grievance Cell establishes a support between the students and the staff and it strives for elimination of unfair atmosphere. Suggestion boxes are kept for this purpose.

IDENTITY CARD

Laminated Identity Card is issued to the students soon after admission for the full period of study subject and to be produced on demand at any time. The students must bring their respective Identity Card every day.

BUS-FACILITIES

Twenty seven buses are operated on all working days from Tirupattur, Vaniyambadi, Ambur, Alangayam, Natrampalli, Pallikonda, Pernambut, Umarabath, Kandhili, Mittur, Jolarpet, Venkatasamudharam, Velakkalnatham, Krishnagiri, Pochampalli, Gudiyatham, Paratharami, Madhanur, Narayanapuram and Thagarakuppam with regular boarding stages on the way to college. The bus fare will be collected from each student yearly on the stipulated date.

HOSTEL

Separate hostel accommodation with all amenities is provided. Healthy Vegetarian food is served to the hostel inmates.

CANTEEN

A canteen is functioning to cater the needs of the staff and students.

ADD ON AND LIFE SKILL DEVELOPMENT COURSES

To enrich oneself for the better placement and employable opportunities, Add-on courses are organized along with regular stream

of studies. The Add-on course includes Personality Development, Development of Professional Skills, Communication Skills, Effective Public Speaking, Interview Techniques, Time Management, Problem Solving, Leadership in Action, Human Relations and Decision Making. MCA and other PG students are given training in advanced technical courses and Commerce/BBA/BCA students are provided with Tally software. The rest of the students will be given training pertaining to their respective courses

HEALTH CHECKUPS

Every student has to undergo a medical checkup during the first term of the academic year. Apart from that every year the college NSS / Rotaract and YRC arranges general medical camp for the students. The college is equipped with all first-aid facilities and in case of emergencies the student will be taken to the hospital.

MENTORING

Specified members of the staff will be assigned the job of mentors. The mentors will help the students in identifying and channelizing the strength towards a better performance for all round development.

THE COLLEGE UNION

- All the students shall be member of the College Union. The objective and aim of the union is to promote the students activities and to develop a sense of loyalty, self-expression, responsibility and self-discipline.
- ♣ The Principal shall be the "Ex-Officio" of the Union. The student chairman shall preside over the ordinary meetings of the Union. The governing body shall be kept informed of all the activities of the College Union.

For the development of intellectual and physical capabilities, the functions like Independence Day, Republic Day, Mahaveer Jayanthi, Sports Day and College Day celebrated during every academic year.

THE NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

- Education through services is the dimension that NSS imparts to the student community. The NSS aims to draw students close to social realities and involves them on social projects with weaker sections of the society.

The students of Business Administration, Computer Science, Computer Applications, Physics, Biochemistry and Biotechnology take up project work in different companies outside the campus, under the guidance of the external and internal guides to gain adequate knowledge. Commerce & Management students go for Industrial Training & Bank Training to equip themselves in the Banking and financial arena.

RESEARCH PROMOTION WING

Research Promotion Wing was established in the Academic year 2011-2012 for carrying out mini projects to inculcate research fervour in both the students and the staff. The Cell conducts research related workshops every academic year.
