attendance. Candidates who have attained less than 50% of attendance have to repeat the course by rejoining after obtaining prior permission from the University to rejoin the course. **A minimum of 90% attendance is required for scholarship purposes.**

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

- ❖ Student shall conduct themselves properly both within and outside the premises. The good name of the college depends upon the conduct of the students. If any student is found short of good behaviour and discipline, she shall be severely penalized or even expelled from the college by the authorities.
- ❖ **This college runs by Jains which is strongly committed to strict vegetarianism. Hence, students are forbidden from bringing and consuming non-vegetarian food of any kind including eggs inside the college and hostel premises. Violation of this rule will lead to severe penalty or even dismissal from the college.**
- ❖ **The students are strictly prohibited from bringing mobile phones or any other electronic devices. If found, strict action will be taken.**
- ❖ Students should wear neat, decent and respectable dress such as Salwarkameez, Chudidhar, Half sarees and Sarees. They should conform to the standards of modesty maintained by the institution.
- ❖ Students should greet the members of the staff and step aside to let them pass. They should stand up when any staff member enters the classroom.
- ❖ Students shall not enter the staff room or office without permission.
- ❖ Students should assemble for common prayer as soon as the bell rings and stand in a line. Late comers will be fined a sum of Rs.25/- per day.
- ❖ Students should be punctual to the classes. A student must not enter or leave the class without the permission of the Assistant Professor.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- ❖ Students should attend all the remedial coaching classes in the subjects in which they are found weak.

EXAMINATION AND PERIODICAL TESTS

- ❖ Mid-Semester and Model examinations are conducted every semester. The student performance in the examination will be discussed during Parent Teacher's Meet.

- ❖ Based on the performance of the students in these examinations, the Principal decides on the eligibility of the student to appear for the University Examinations. The decision of the Principal is final.
- ❖ A student who fares very badly in these examinations or has insufficient attendance will not be permitted to write the University Examinations.
- ❖ Continuous Internal Assessment marks will be allotted based on the performance of the students in the Mid - Semester and Model examinations.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

A Student will be eligible to appear for the University examinations, if,

- ❖ She has attained the requisite 75% attendance.
- ❖ Her conduct and progress in studies during the year have been satisfactory.
- ❖ She has paid all the fees and arrears and has obtained a "No Dues" clearance from the respective Head of Departments.

RULES & REGULATIONS

LIBRARY

- ❖ The college library is open to all members of the college on every working day.
- ❖ Each and every student, on being enrolled in the college becomes a member of the college library.
- ❖ Strict silence should be observed in the library.

- ❖ Any book, which is in great demand, shall be lent only for three days. Library books and library materials must be returned to the library at the end of the academic year, on the due date specified by the Librarian.

The main aim of cultural committee is to enhance extra talents of the students through various cultural activities. Students expose their talents in cultural activities and they are getting excellent exposure on their inborn talents. They are performing both on-stage and off-stage performance during Fine Arts and Cultural competitions. The students are participating in many events like Drama, Singing, Skit, Dance, Dubsmash, Fashion parade etc., during Inter-Department and college programs, Sports day, College day and Art smart Inter-Collegiate competitions.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

NSS primarily focuses on personality development through community service. NSS Student volunteers are allotted 240 hours to do their services. The NSS aims to draw students close to social realities and involves them on social projects with weaker sections of the society.

Our college has two units of National Service Scheme with two programme officers and with 200 volunteers. The activities of NSS have two spheres i.e. regular and special camp activities.

CAREER GUIDANCE & PLACEMENT CELL

Placement cell prepare the students for 100% placement in their campus recruitment drive.

Commerce, Management and science students go for Industrial Training, Bank Training, Field Trip and Industrial Visit to equip themselves in the Banking, Financial arena and Research Area.

RESEARCH PROMOTION WING

Research Promotion Wing was established in the Academic year 2011-2012 for carrying out mini projects to inculcate research fervour in both the students and the staff. The Cell conducts research related workshops in every academic year.
